Gail Kerr, MD, DM, FACR, FRCP, FACP

Chief of the Division of Rheumatology, Washington DC Veterans Affairs Medical Center Chief of the Division of Rheumatology, Howard University Hospital Professor of Medicine at Georgetown University and The Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences

Dr. Kerr is Chief of the Division of Rheumatology at the Washington D.C. Veterans Affairs Medical Center and Howard University Hospital, and Professor of Medicine at Georgetown University and the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. Dr. Kerr completed both her medical degree and internal medicine residency at the University of the West Indies in Kingston, Jamaica, where she also served as Chief Resident. She subsequently completed fellowship training at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases.

A highly regarded and internationally recognized physician-researcher, Dr. Kerr's scholarship has included evaluation of therapeutic modalities for gout, osteoarthritis, ankylosing spondylitis, psoriatic arthritis, rheumatoid arthritis and systemic lupus erythematosus. Her numerous publications have included seminal articles on the optimal management of rheumatic diseases including in minority populations.

Dr. Kerr has had an exceptional record of national and international service including as a member of the FDA Arthritis Advisory Board and the USP Rheumatology Expert Committee, as well as Chair of the VA National Rheumatology Consortium. She is currently a member of the Steering Committee for the Caribbean Rheumatology Association, a Board Member of the VA Institute of Clinical Research, and Chair of the Ethnic Minority Rheumatoid Arthritis Consortium.

Named by her peers and colleagues as one of the top 21 doctors in the Washington-Baltimore-Northern Virginia Area, Dr. Kerr is the recipient of multiple awards for her research excellence, exceptional contributions to graduate medical education and service. She is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, the Royal Colleges of Physicians and the American College of Rheumatology.
