Inaugural GME Wellness Day June 20, 2019

Under the leadership of Dr. Peter Sealy, Associate Dean of Graduate Medical Education and the direction of faculty members, Dr. Katherine Manuel and Dr. David Bowman, the theme of the Wellness Day was "The Thriving Physician". The morning started out with a health fair, including screenings for blood pressure, sickle cell disease, fasting cholesterol, glucose and body fat analysis. In addition, the health fair included booths hosted by HU College of Dentistry, the Family Health Center, Pastoral Care Services and Cigna, so that the residents would learn what services they have available to them. The presentations were highlighted by the invited guest speaker, Dr. Benjamin Doolittle from Yale, who spoke on preventing burnout, and a workshop on having a mental wealth (not just mental health) strategy by the HUH psychiatry residency director, Dr. Danielle Hairston; these were open to faculty as well as the new residents.

Effective classroom management is much more than simply administering corrective measures when a student misbehaves; it's about developing proactive ways to prevent problems from occurring in the first place while creating a positive learning environment.

Establishing a climate for learning is one of the most challenging aspects of teaching, and one of the most difficult skills to master, even at the post-secondary level. For those new to the profession, failure to set the right tone will greatly hinder your effectiveness as a teacher.
