FOREWORD

This booklet contains the schedule of courses, except for electives, offered to medical students at Howard University College of Medicine. It provides a calendar of events, examination dates, and schedule of clerkships. Where applicable, non-medical graduate students enrolled in medical courses will comply with the class and examination schedules set forth in this booklet. The respective departments will schedule other courses, seminars, and examinations for graduate and other students. The schedules do not show dates and times for quizzes and other evaluations.

CURRICULUM – M.D. PROGRAM

The program of instruction of the College of Medicine provides the forum for the students to acquire the essential knowledge, skills, behaviors and attitudes necessary for the practice of medicine as set forth in the Educational Objectives for Howard University College of Medicine. The details of these objectives are shown in the College of Medicine Policies and Procedures Manual, also called the “Policies Manual”. In addition, time is provided in the schedule for elective courses (Electives Manual), so that students can explore areas of their need or special interests.

First Year

The first year integrated curriculum has seven instructional units. They include two 2 units of instructions concerning Molecules and Cells, three dealing with Structure and Function and two units of instruction in courses entitled Medicine and Society. Instructions in clinical skills and communication skills are integrated in these units.

During the first semester instructional units in Molecules and Cells include: macromolecules and metabolism, molecular and cell biology, tissue histology, nutrition, basic microbiology, genetics and immunology. The Medicine and Society unit consists of clinical and learning skills development. The structure and function block begins in the first semester with instruction in bones, muscles and skin.

During the second semester, the Structure and Function units include: head and neck; nervous system; thorax, abdomen and pelvis. The Medicine and Society unit include: nutrition and global and environmental health.

Second Year

The second year integrated curriculum has nine units. They include six units of instruction covering the organ systems, one unit in introduction to clinical medicine, one unit in physical diagnosis and one unit dealing with medicine and society. Instructions in clinical skills and communication skills are further integrated in the units taught during this year.

During the first semester, instructional units in the organ systems include general principles; hematopoetic, lymphoreticular, musculoskeletal and skin systems; cardiovascular and respiratory systems; and the renal/genito-urinary systems. There is a semester-long unit on Introduction to Clinical Medicine.

During the second semester, the organ systems includes instructional units covering the gastrointestinal, endocrine and reproductive systems; the central nervous system and special topics. Physical Diagnosis and Medicine and Society are two other units in the second semester. The Medicine and Society unit includes complementary/alternative medicine and biometrics/ epidemiology.

Third and Fourth Years

The third and fourth years consist of units of instruction in a continuum of clerkships (internal medicine, neurology & rehabilitation, surgery, obstetrics & gynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry and family medicine) and examinations in the various clinical subjects. All junior medical students are required to take a course in Introduction to Health Care Ethics and Jurisprudence either during the first or the second semester. During the fourth year there are two required clerkships– internal medicine and surgery. During these clerkships the students function as acting interns (AI). A primary care rotation is also required during the fourth year, but the student elects the site and the discipline in a primary care field for the experience (all ambulatory in internal medicine, pediatrics, family medicine, adolescent

medicine, and office gynecology). All fourth year students are required to take a fourth year course called *Intern Readiness Course* (IRC). The IRC focuses on procedural skills that first year residents are expected to perform. Each student has the opportunity for clinical or research experience through five or more electives – one of which is the primary care elective. All rotations in the fourth year are four (4) weeks in duration. All clinical rotations (required or electives) must be approved by the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs.

ELECTIVES

Time is available for elective courses presented in the form of lectures, research, seminar and clinical experiences. These electives are designed to broaden the basic knowledge acquired in the core curriculum and also to meet the needs of individual students that arise from differences in background, interests, and choice of careers in medicine or medically related professions. All electives must be approved by the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs. (*Please refer to the booklet on electives for details*)

Beginning in the second semester of the first year, the freshman medical student may enroll in one (1) elective per semester through the second year. Enrollment in electives during the first two years may be done at the option of the student, and is not required for promotion to the second or third years. Clinical electives are not open to first and second year students. These electives cannot be credited to meet the fourth year requirements. First and second year students are strongly advised to select electives that will enhance their preclinical preparation.

Elective Requirements: Elective time is not available in the clerkship schedule of the third year. However, in the fourth year, a maximum of twenty four (24) weeks or a minimum of twenty (20) weeks must be spent in elective courses, or research activity. These elective weeks include the primary care rotation. No more than eight (8) weeks (if 24 weeks of electives are chosen) can be spent in the same specialty, or subspecialty and no more than eight (8) weeks in research. A student may appeal to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs to take more than six (6) electives.

During senior electives, students may simultaneously serve as externs, or receive compensation as a US-PHS appointee in connection with an approved elective. The elective, however, must be a training experience and temporary employment cannot be substituted for electives.

Intramural electives: Students are required to take at least one elective at Howard University Hospital. This does not include the AI, IRC, or the primary care elective.

Extramural Electives: In choosing electives, senior students may enroll in courses offered at Howard University (described in the booklet, "Senior Elective Courses") or, upon approval, electives may be taken at another institution in the United States. Application for most extramural electives is facilitated by the Visiting Student Application System (VSAS). The process is detailed in the electives booklet that is published annually. Final approval of electives is made by the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs prior to transmitting the application to the extramural host institution where the elective is to be taken.

International Electives: Students may also enroll in international electives. In this case, in addition to the standard steps the student must complete additional forms available in the office of the Senior Associate Dean for Academic Affairs.

Visiting Students: Students from LCME accredited medical schools and students from accredited schools of osteopathic medicine may be accepted for electives in the fourth year at Howard University, providing space is available.

Each student must provide the list of all electives showing the following:

- Name of elective
- Institution where the student will rotate for the elective
- Dates for the electives
- Supervisor or contact person for each elective
- Other requested (by the Senior Associate Dean for Academic Affairs) information for international electives

Service Learning: A list of opportunities for students in the College of Medicine to participate in service learning activities is maintained in the office of the Associate Dean for Student Affairs and Admission. The College of Medicine encourages and will support students to participate in these activities to the extent possible.

Research Opportunities: The College of Medicine encourages students to participate in research. In addition to take electives in research in the senior year, opportunities also exist during all 4 years in the curriculum for students to participate in such activities. Students should contact the Associate Dean for Research for more information.

OTHER PROGRAMS

Combined BS-M.D. Program

This is a cooperative program at Howard University between the Colleges of Medicine and the College of Arts and Sciences which allows the student to complete the requirements for both the B.S. and the M.D. degrees in six (or seven) years instead of the customary eight years. A limited number of students are admitted to the medical program from the College of Arts and Sciences as part of the entering class of traditionally selected students.

Combined M.D./Ph.D. Program

This program may not be offered for new candidates for the 2015-2016 academic year

The College of Medicine and the Graduate School co-sponsor this interdisciplinary program which prepares students for leadership roles as clinicians/scientists/scholars. The requirements for both the M.D. degree and the Ph.D. degree in the student's selected graduate department can be completed in approximately seven years without any diminution in either the M.D. or Ph.D. curriculum. The graduate departments that currently award the Ph.D. degree in this program are Anatomy, Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, Biology, Chemistry, Genetics and Human Genetics, Microbiology, Pharmacology, and Physiology and Biophysics.

Dual M.D./MBA Degrees Program

A limited number of medical students in the College of Medicine may enroll in the MBA program, so that at the end of five years these students will receive the M.D. and the MBA degrees. Students must meet the criteria for admission to the MBA program and must also successfully complete the first two years in the medical school. Students are strongly advised to sit for the USMLE Step 1 before starting the MBA program. The students will then be granted a one year leave of absence from the College of Medicine to enroll in the Business School. After successful completion of the MBA curriculum, the students then return to the College of Medicine to complete the requirements for the M.D. degree. Medical students who wish to enroll in this program may obtain more information from the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs in the College of Medicine and must write a letter to the said Associate Dean requesting permission program prior to applying for the MBA program.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Student Academic Support Program (SASP)

The Office of Medical Education (OME) presents problem solving, critical thinking and assessment of learning styles strategies for concept mapping, to medical students during Freshman Orientation week and during the early part of the first semester. Individual sessions are also offered throughout the school year. Academic support is offered to all students. Students who are identified as requiring academic reinforcement are referred to the OME for academic counseling and/or tutorial support.

MedSTAR (Medical Student Taught Academic Review)

The MedSTAR program has medical students who serve as tutors and who are selected on the basis of their academic performance, scholastic standing and personality traits to provide assistance to students who request support in handling course content.

Academic Support also includes intensive review sessions that are presented during the summer in the **Summer Directed Study Program (SDSP)** for students who have incurred deficiencies during the regular school year. The Committee on Promotions, Graduation and Prizes prescribes enrollment in the Summer Directed Study Program for those students considered eligible in accordance with the Policy on Student Promotions of the College of Medicine. Other programs to increase retention and graduation of students include: **reexaminations, repeat clerkship, repeat an academic year, and financial support** for review courses in preparation for the USMLE.

GRADES, PROMOTION AND GRADUATION

A statement of the policy governing student promotions is provided to each student at the beginning of the each academic year. The Committee on Student Promotions, Graduation and Prizes of the College of Medicine will review student performances and make decisions concerning promotions periodically throughout the year. A report of grades is provided to each student following each examination, and at the end of each semester. The Office of the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, Student Records Section, issues all grade reports. It is the responsibility of each student to check Blackboard and BisonWeb to ensure his/her courses and clerkships are correctly recorded. Grades are issued directly to the student on Blackboard and BisonWeb, and not released by fax, email, or to a third person. The College of Medicine may honor a signed written request by the student/graduate to release his/her grades to a third party.

Satisfactory student performance, including demonstration of appropriate professional behavior, is mandatory for promotion and for graduation. Students are required to pass the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) Step 1 for promotion to the third year. Students are also required to pass the USMLE Step 2 Clinical Knowledge Examination (CK) and the USMLE Clinical Skills Assessment (CS) in order to be eligible to participate in the NRMP and for graduation. Grades in the College of Medicine are reported as H (Honors), S (Satisfactory), or U (Unsatisfactory) for medical students. Criteria for promotions and graduation are shown in the policies manual
